Summary of Venâncio Mondlane's Plans for Post-Election Protests (Nov 20-22)

Protest Activities:

National Mourning: 3 days to honor over 50 deaths since the protests began.

Black Attire: Participants encouraged to wear black or include a black piece of clothing.

Daily Actions at 12 PM:

- **Vehicles:** Stop for 15 minutes between 12-12:15 and honk horns. Between 12:15 to 13:00, keep driving but continue to honk.
- **Non-drivers:** Stand on streets with homemade posters.
- **Pot Banging:** From 9 PM, limited to homes and neighborhoods to prevent vandalism by infiltrators.

Key Points of Speech:

Peaceful Nature of Protests: Venâncio Mondlane emphasized the protests' commitment to being peaceful. He condemned the acts of vandalism observed during earlier demonstrations, attributing them to infiltrators aiming to discredit the movement.

Criticism of President Nyusi:

- Mondlane criticized the President for failing to take meaningful steps toward dialogue to address the political and social unrest.

(VM speech cont.) He accused Nyusi of exacerbating tensions by singing the provocative phrase "let it hurt whoever it hurts," which he described as inflammatory and dismissive of the protesters' grievances. Mondlane also warned against any declaration of a state of emergency, which he believes would further suppress citizens' rights and escalate the crisis.

Rejection of Election Annulment Proposal: Mondlane dismissed the suggestion by Renamo's leader to annul the elections, describing it as a ploy to obscure the true results. He argued that such a move would undermine the protesters' demands for transparency and accountability in the electoral process.



Summary of President Nyusi's speech:

1. Appeal to State Security Stakeholders

- Emphasized the use of non-lethal, dissuasive measures by security forces.
- Encouraged the enforcement of rules of engagement (RoE) to protect citizens' freedom of movement for essential activities such as marriages, funerals, and church services.

2. Promoting Unity and Reducing Political Tensions

- Urged that political adversaries should not be treated as enemies, emphasizing that no party is purely "angelic" or "demonic."
- • Condemned hate speech and the "devilization" of political actors for personal gain.

3. Updates on National Situation

- Reported 200 strikes leading to: Restricted movement, looting, sabotage, and attacks on infrastructure, including electrical towers. 19 fatalities, including five police officers (PRM officials). Closure of 19 vaccination units and significant reductions (60%) in hospital admissions and staff presence in medical facilities.
- Highlighted the broader impacts: Fear spreading among communities, compounding stress on public and private sectors. Damage to national pride, particularly regarding attacks on Mozambique's National Soccer Team. Ports, railways, and traffic infrastructure have been vandalized, exacerbating macroeconomic challenges.

4. Consequences of Unrest

- Inflation, scarcity of essential goods, and increased public financial strain.
- Reputational damage leading to reduced foreign investments and job creation risks.
- Acknowledged parallels with other nations experiencing social turmoil, warning against escalation or potential “coup d’état” scenarios.

5. Call for Dialogue and Peace

- Affirmed that channels of dialogue remain open, with diverse societal and political leaders advocating for peace. Invited all four presidential candidates, including Daniel Chapo, Ossufo Momade, and VM, for discussions on resolving the crisis. Highlighted a decrease in incidents as a positive step toward restoring stability.

6. Encouraging Responsibility and Stability

- Urged influencers and leaders to promote peace and avoid fueling hate speech. Stressed the importance of restoring calm, ensuring public safety, and protecting both private and public institutions. Called on citizens, especially children and young people, to avoid participation in disruptive activities.

7. Commitment to Governance and Normalcy

- Reiterated the government’s dedication to maintaining freedom of expression and circulation while ensuring adherence to rules. Promised continued work toward a peaceful, inclusive Mozambique where everyone shares in national prosperity. Urged patience while awaiting the Constitutional Council’s final election results.

Closing Message: President Nyusi called for an end to violence, appealing to all citizens to focus on rebuilding trust and stability, ensuring a return to normal life for all.

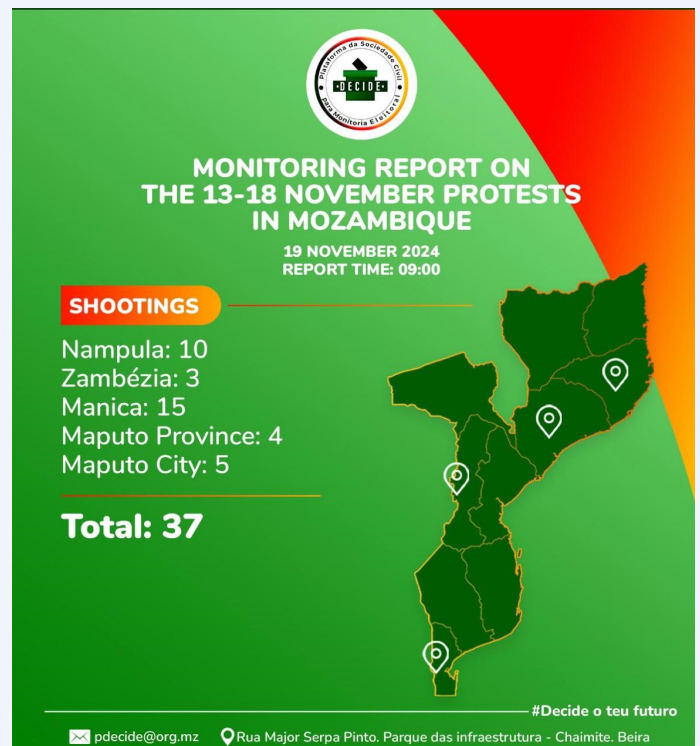
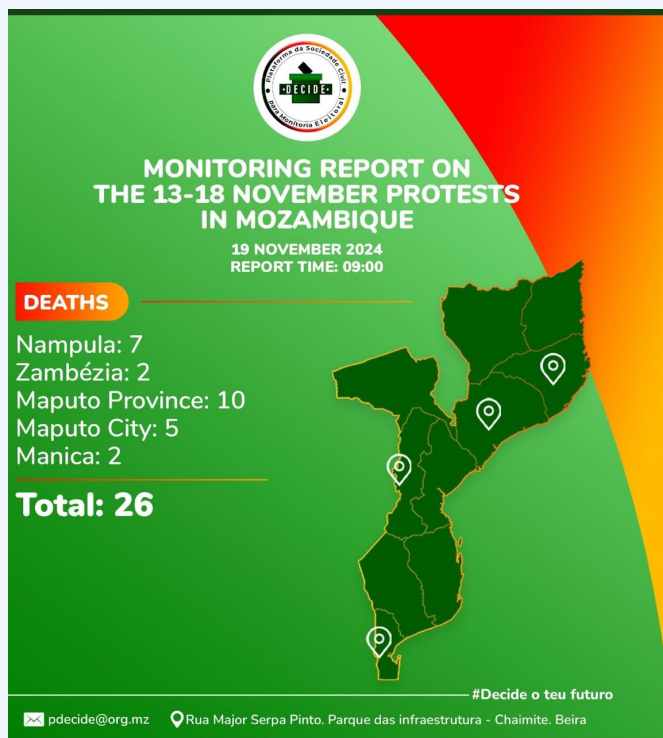
Shared From Zitamar: It has been over three months since Rwandan and Mozambican security forces launched their joint offensive against Islamic State-backed insurgents in Cabo Delgado province’s Macomia district. When it began, hopes were high that the offensive could pacify Macomia in a matter of weeks. Those hopes have faded away. The offensive is dragging on, and there is no sign that victory is getting closer. The district town of Macomia may have been secured, along with the coastline, but control of the countryside in one of Cabo Delgado’s bigger districts remains uncertain. In particular, the insurgents are holding on to their stronghold in the Catupa forest. Government claims that the administrative posts of Mucojo and Quiterajo have been secured do not match up with reports of insurgent activity there, and satellite images showed widespread fires across Quiterajo yesterday.

Observador - Venâncio Mondlane and Civil Action: A civil action seeks €480,000 from Venâncio Mondlane for damages related to protests in Maputo following Mozambique's elections. The protests, which involved confrontations between police and demonstrators, were marked by tear gas and violence, with Mondlane criticizing the security forces' actions as oppressive and undermining fundamental rights.

Zitamar News - Ancuabe Incident: Insurgents in Cabo Delgado killed at least 12 members of the Naparama militia in Ancuabe district. This attack highlights ongoing insecurity in the region as local defense forces continue to face challenges from militant groups.

#ALERT 19:00 - Insurgent presence in Ancuabe still highly likely. Please take precautions for staff working in the field.

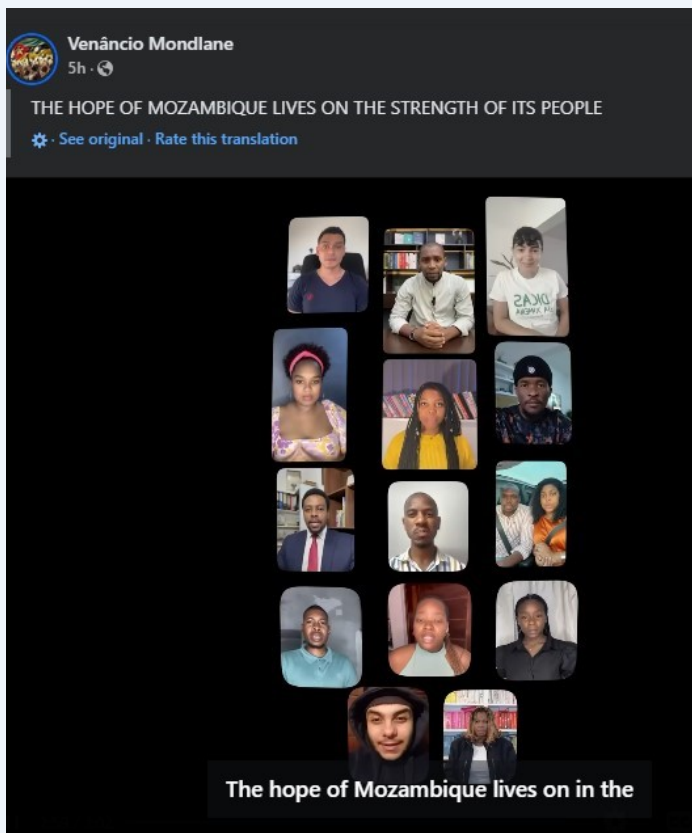

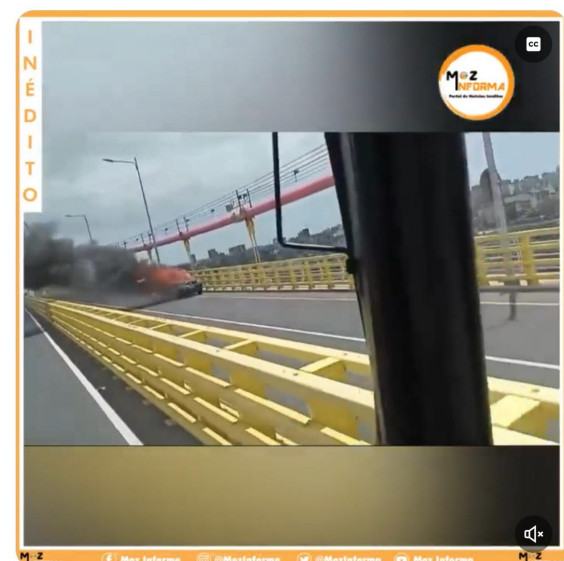
