The December 16, 2024, report highlights several critical issues in Mozambique. Cyclone Chido has caused widespread devastation, leaving 200,000 people without electricity and threatening 650,000 children—about half the population of Hawaii. In Ressano Garcia, tensions escalated into violent clashes between police and locals, resulting in at least five deaths. Meanwhile, healthcare centers in Marracuene and Nametil have been shut down due to financial disputes and vandalism. Post-election unrest continues, though religious services have resumed despite ongoing protests. President Nyusi has called for calm, emphasizing the need to stabilize conditions to resume graphite mining in Balama.

## INCIDENTS 16 Dec

- Around 650,000 children are at risk due to Cyclone Chido in Mozambique, the NGO Save the Children warned, adding that several aid actions are currently taking place. [LINK](#)
- In Ressano Garcia, police used bullets and tear gas to restore order, resulting in at least five deaths and significant tension between the population and authorities. [LINK](#)
- Religious services normally resumed this Sunday after a week of post-election protests, with believers gathering in large numbers and calling for peace and unity. [LINK](#)
- President Nyusi urged Balama residents to stay calm so Syrah Resources can resume graphite mining amid post-election unrest. [LINK](#)
- Former Renamo guerrillas and supporters threaten to disrupt party headquarters until a National Council meeting date is set. [LINK](#)
- The Frelimo party complains of "political intolerance", denouncing threats and attacks from protesters, and vandalizing and destroying its headquarters. [LINK](#)
- The NGO Plataforma Electoral Decide refused to provide the Constitutional Council with October 9 vote records, citing irregularities that "would serve to legitimize fraud". [LINK](#)
- The Frelimo Party's Political Committee urged the Government to urgently lower prices of basic products to alleviate the cost of living. [LINK](#)
- Criminals vandalized the Nametil Health Center in Nampula, causing its closure and raising cholera concerns. [LINK](#)
- Cahora Bassa level critical: The level of water in the reservoir behind the Cahora Bassa dam in Mozambique's Tete province has fallen to just 26 per cent of its capacity, the lowest level in 30 years. [LINK](#)
- President Filipe Nyusi has compared the attacks on cholera treatment units to the Islamist terrorism in the northern province of Cabo Delgado. [LINK](#)

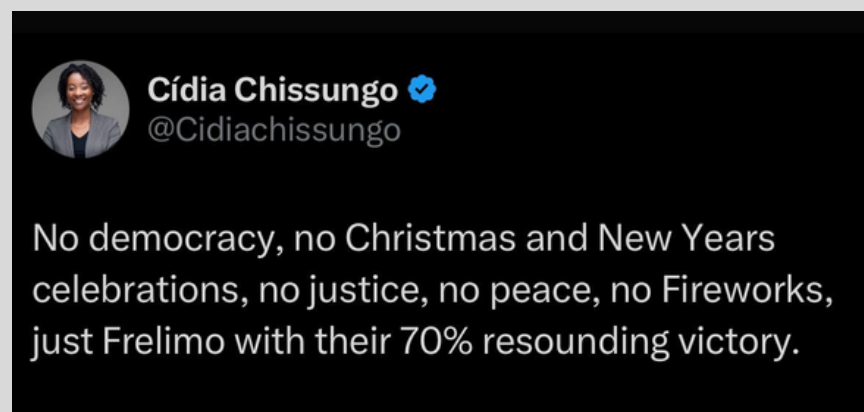
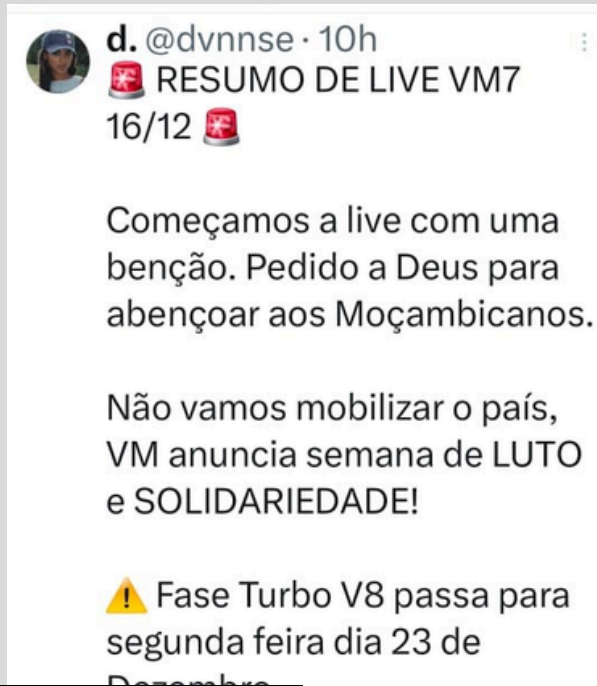
## VM7 LIVE Dec 16 Summary:

- **Focus on Cyclone Chido Victims:** Calls for contributions to aid affected individuals; actions this week will be non-confrontational.
- **Cabo Delgado Challenges:** Cyclone devastation compounded by terrorism; military strained and underpaid, with families left in the dark about missing soldiers; well-equipped Rwandan forces.
- Week of Luto (Mourning):
- **From Thursday to Sunday:** Honor 130 fallen heroes; wear black or white; no violence, protests, or roadblocks.
- **Daily (13:00–13:15):** Pause for national anthem and prayers for justice and the deceased.
- **Sunday (21:00–22:00):** Whistles and vuvuzelas tribute.
- **December 23rd Protests:** Awaiting Constitutional Council's decision; ensure healthcare, ambulances, and lawyers can move freely.
- **Turbo V8 Resumes:** Protests will resume based on Lucia Ribeira's decision on December 23rd.
- **Prayers and Fasting:** Muslims and Christians encouraged to pray and fast for justice, particularly on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
- **Vision for 2025:** Democratic vision for a pluralistic, modern, inclusive Mozambique.
- **Focus on Victims:** Emphasis on victims' stories over material concerns.
- In Luis Cabral, Fabio, now in a wheelchair after being shot for protesting, and his mother, is in need of support.
- **Texalom police incident:** Seven people run over by police remain uncounted in official death statistics, the estimated toll to be around 200.
- **Portagems:** Call to keep them open until January 15th to reduce financial burden.
- **Resource Exploitation:** Calls for cessation of resource exploitation until the country is better organized.

- **Fair Pricing & Tax Relief:** Advocating for fair prices and tax relief for everyday citizens.
- **Ongoing Broadcasts:** Daily broadcast to keep people updated and informed.

## ANALYSIS OF SOCIAL MEDIA TRENDS

- **Economic Struggles:** Amidst political unrest and economic challenges, citizens are demanding fair pricing and tax relief due to rising costs and financial burdens.
- **Resource Exploitation:** There is a strong demand to pause resource extraction in Mozambique until it can ensure equitable benefits for its population, especially regarding graphite mining in Balama.
- **Protests and Grievances:** social media is mobilizing protests and expressing dissatisfaction with the government, highlighting issues like post-election unrest, delayed compensation, and police brutality.
- **Calls for Justice:** Social media users are demanding justice and accountability for protestor deaths and police violence, calling for greater transparency from authorities.
- **Social media in Mozambique** amplifies dissatisfaction with the political and economic situation, mobilizes protests, and advocates for reforms and justice.
